This year’s ESA conference in Prague marks the end of another period of our board that was elected during the business meeting at the ESA conference in Turin in 2013. Since then we have organized a Midterm Conference in Klagenfurt (Austria), a PhD Spring School in Duisburg-Essen (Germany) and we have fostered and encouraged the international ex-

change of Sociology of Ageing scholars through our website and our newsletter.
